Game 2

The Riveters held off a late Flower City comeback bit to secure the first win in team history. Tanum Nelson scored the club's first goal in the 31st minute and added the second a minute later. Lucia Wells scored the Riveters' third before Sam Cipolla tallied in the 83rd minute and stoppage time for the hosts.

Last Meeting with Cleveland

Riveters SC 0, Cleveland Force SC 0 Highmark Stadium, Pittsburgh, Pa. • May 16, 2025 Game 1

The first match in Riveters history was played in front of a sellout crowd of 6,077 fans, but they were unable to break a deadlock with the Force. The Riveters had a goal by Piper Coffield disallowed early in the second half, and Pauline Nelles made two saves for the clean sheet.



GAME 3 - QUICK STRIKES

- Only three matches into their existence, the Riveters play their first rematch by once again taking on the Force. The teams played to a 0-0 draw at sold out Highmark Stadium in the first-ever Riveters match on May 16.
- Riveters head coach Scott Gibson leads the team after nearly two decades serving as the director of the Riverhounds Academy, where he coached the club's USL Academy League girls team and headed their Elite Clubs National League program.
- Midfielder Tanum Nelson scored the first two goals in Riveters history in a two-minute stretch of the win last Saturday over Flower City in Rochester, N.Y. Nelson, a Vermont native, also plays her college soccer in upstate New York at Cornell University, a little more than an hour from Rochester.
- Forward Lucia Wells also scored against Flower City, making the former Riverhounds Academy and current Pitt player the first Pittsburgh-raised goal scorer for the Riveters.
- Goalkeeper Pauline Nelles, a former German youth international, made two saves in the draw against Cleveland to record the first clean sheet in Riveters' history.
- Twenty-one players have appeared for the Riveters through their first two matches, but three stalwarts along the back line are the only ones to have played all 180 minutes — Bella Vozar, Natalia DiSora and Piper Coffield.
- In addition to her defensive work, Coffield also has been a factor in the attack. The center back had what would have been the first goal in team history disallowed in the draw against the Force. Undaunted, it was Coffield's free kick that set up Nelson for the opening goal the next week against Flower City.
- Midfielder Tessa Dellarose was selected as the first captain for the Riveters. A native of Grindstone, Pa., in nearby Fayette County, Dellarose's resumé includes representing the United States at the Under-20 level, the 2024 NCAA Championship with the University of North Carolina, and being named the Most Valuable Player of the 2024 The Soccer Tournament, where she and US Women won the tournament and \$1 million prize.

Why the Riveters?

The name of the Pittsburgh Riveters Soccer Club was selected as the result of a fan vote that occurred in 2024 after four finalists were decided. The name "Riveters" won a clear majority in that vote, making that the name of the Pittsburgh's new W League team.

The Riveters name harkens back to the World War II image of "Rosie the Riveter," the most famous version of which came from the "We Can Do It!" poster commissioned in 1943 by Pittsburgh-based Westinghouse Electric Company. Since then, the image of Rosie has expanded to represent more than the war effort; it has become an emblem of women's empowerment and their contribution to the work force at large.

HEAD COACH SCOTT GIBSON



Scott Gibson was named the first head coach in Riveters history on Sept. 25, 2024, giving him the reins as preparations for Pittsburgh's new women's soccer team kicked into gear ahead of the 2025 USL W League season.

Gibson is the longtime Director of the Riverhounds Academy, a role he has held since the Academy's launch in 2007, and he also the head of the Academy's girls program in the Elite Clubs National League. He has played a part in the development of more than 100 young women who have progressed to college soccer careers, including top athletes at elite programs such as North Carolina, Notre Dame, Pitt, Rutgers and Indiana. More than a half dozen girls from the Hounds Academy have been invited to U.S. Youth National Team camps, and in the past year and a half, two have represented the United States in competition — Tessa Dellarose in the U-20 age group and Sierra Dupre at the U-16

A native of Saltburn, England, Gibson came to the U.S. to play collegiately at Duquesne University. After his college career, Gibson had a stint as a pro player with the Pittsburgh Riverhounds in the USL Second Division, while at the same time moving into his role as Riverhounds Academy Director. As the director, Gibson has overseen the growth of the Academy from its roots strictly as a training program to a comprehensive developmental and team model serving more Date Hired: than 1,100 boys and girls annually.

Teams that Gibson coached include the first Hounds girls team, which in 2013 won the U-15 US Club Soccer National Championship, as well as the 2007 Girls team that reached the final of the ECNL North American Cup in 2023. He also served as an assistant coach with the Riverhounds pro team during the 2014 season, and he has been selected to coach in the ECNL's National Selection Game — all-star events at the league's annual college showcases — in Houston in 2023 Alma Mater: and Dallas in 2024.
